> SYMBOLS ON THE EXTERNAL DISPLAY

Message LED \sim



- · Flashes when a new message is received
- · Stops flashing as soon as the received message has been read

Call LED

- Flashes when there is a missed call
- Stops flashing as soon as all the calls have been viewed Battery LED ____
- Slow flashing: Battery is charging
- On constantly: Battery is fully charged
- · Rapid flashing: Battery is out of charge

1. GETTING STARTED

> Inserting a SIM card





- Remove the battery cover (opening in the bottom left-hand corner).
- Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder with the gold contacts facing down.

> Inserting and charging the battery







- Insert the battery, making sure that the battery contacts touch the phone's gold contacts.
- Place the battery cover over the battery and press it down until it clicks into place.
- Plug the charging cable into the USB port on the bottom of the phone.
- Attention: Charge the battery for at least four hours before the first time you use it. Only use batteries and chargers that are permitted for use with this specific model.

> Turning on the phone

- Pressing the wkey for at least two seconds switches the phone on.
- To turn the phone off, press the b key for two seconds again.

> Using a new SIM card for the first time:

Enter the four-digit PIN code (personal identification number)

⇒ Press () to confirm the code.

The PIN code is a four-digit number that is intended to prevent somebody else from being able to switch on your mobile phone. You have a maximum of three attempts to enter the correct number. If you enter the wrong number three times in a row, you will only be able to unblock the SIM card with the PUK code. You will find the PIN code and PUK code in the documents supplied by your network operator.

⇒ Set time⇒ [[

⇒ Set date⇒ [(

Saving energy

If a few seconds pass without the phone receiving any input from you, the screen will go blank to save energy. In the event of an incoming call or you pressing any key, the screen will automatically light up again.

2. USING THE PHONE

In standby mode the phone is on, but is not running any applications (calls, SMS messages, etc.).

> Using the menu

Press \(\bigcap \) to open the menu.

- Menu items: Messages, Radio, Tools, Phone book, Call info and Settings
- Press and/or to flick through the menu items.
 At the top of the screen, the menu item currently highlighted will be displayed.
- Press (to open a menu item.
- Menu items can be selected directly using the digits assigned to them.
- Options which you can select by pressing
 or are displayed at the bottom of the screen.
- To return to standby mode, press several times or close the phone.

> Dual-function keys

Some keys have additional functions if they are pressed and held down for a few seconds:

1 key: Listen to your voicemail

*+ key: + for country code, e.g. +49 for Germany

key: Silent mode on/off

3. CALLS

> Incoming call

- To answer: Open the phone and press [].
- To reject: Press or close the phone.
- To mute the ringtone temporarily:
 Press the button (on the side of the phone).

> Ending a call

Press or close the phone.

ii If the screen has gone dark during the call, press — twice.

> Dialling

Enter the number you want to dial (incl. the area code) using the keypad. ⇒ Start the call by pressing .

> Redialling

When the phone is on standby, press to call up your call history.

- ⇒ Press and 🖲 to select a number.
- ⇒ Start the call by pressing [[.

> Hands-free mode

Press during a call to open the Options and turn the hands-free function on or off.

4. SMS MESSAGES

- Menu items: Write message, Received, Unsent, Sent, Delete messages, Text templates, Send contact by SMS, SMS in PhoneBK and SMS settings
- > Writing a message

Enter text using the keypad.

Each key has several characters assigned to it, which can be selected by pressing the respective key several times.

(E.g. $2x \frac{4}{8hl}$, $1x \frac{2}{8hc}$, $3x \frac{5}{9kl}$, $3x \frac{5}{9kl}$ and $3x \frac{6}{9hc}$ for Hallo)

The symbols available vary according to which language you are using.

Press # to change the input method.

abc ⇒ Lower case only **Abc** ⇒ Upper and lower case

ABC ⇒ Upper case only **123** ⇒ Digits

> Sending a message Options ⇒ Send to ⇒ Enter a number or open Contacts by pressing Search.

> Receiving a message

Received messages are indicated by an audio signal and the $\mathbf{\Sigma}$ symbol.

- Press to open a received message immediately.
- To view your message list, select **Messages** ⇒ **Received**.

5. TOOLS

> Menu items: Alarm clock, Calendar, Calculator, Bluetooth

5.1 Alarm clock

· Setting the time

Enable the alarm clock ⇒ Enter the time

⇒ Confirm by pressing **(**.

The alarm clock will now go off at the time you have set every day.

- Off: Disable alarm clock
- Switch off the ringing alarm clock by pressing
- Mute the alarm by pressing (it will ring again after 5 minutes).

5.2 Bluetooth

This function allows you to use Bluetooth-enabled hands-free kits wirelessly.

- · Bluetooth on/off
- Connect ⇒ Search for new devices

Search for devices you want to connect

⇒ Select devices by pressing 【

Devices that have been connected before will be recognised and connected automatically.

Manage devices ⇒ Visibility ⇒ On

Make your phone visible so that

it can connect to a Bluetooth device.

6. CONTACTS

- Menu items: Search name, Add contact, Edit contact, Delete, Send contact via SMS, Copy contact, My number, Speed dial keys, Emergency numbers, Phone book settings and SMS in PhoneBK.
- Saving contacts (name and number)
 ⇒ Phone book ⇒ Add contact
 ⇒ Enter name and number
- Always save names and numbers with the international dialling code, e.g. save +41 for Switzerland, +43 for Austria and +49 for Germany.
- > Searching for contacts:
 - Contacts ⇒ Search name
 Press and to flick through the entries
 or enter the first few letters of the entry you're looking for using the keypad (and continue flicking with if necessary).
 - ⇒ Once you've selected an entry, press \(\bar{\chi}\) to start a call.

> Speed dial keys ♣¹ ♣□ ♣□

You can assign speed dial keys to numbers you call often.

- · Saving a speed dial key
 - ⇒ Press one of the speed dial keys
 - ⇒ Enter a **name** and **number** or **Search** for a contact in the phone book.
- · Changing or deleting a speed dial key
 - ⇒ Open the menu item **Speed dial keys** in the **Contacts** menu
 - ⇒ Select a speed dial key and change or delete its link to a particular contact.

7. SETTINGS

Menu items: Silent/Sleep mode, Sound & alert, Handset volume, Hands-free volume, Display & light, Time & date, Language, Call waiting, Call forwarding, Suppress number, Help texts, Network selection,, Voicemail number, Emergency numbers, Emergency button, Security settings, Phone book settings, 0000 to enter settings and Master reset

7.1 Sound & alerts

You can personalise the settings for tones, signals and vibration or select a set of predefined settings (profile).

Menu items: Ringtone, Alarm melody, Ringer volume, Silent/Sleep mode, Meeting/Theater mode, Maximum/ Bus mode, Increasing ring, Vibra for call, Vibra for alarm, Key tones, Message alert, Vibra for messages, Handset volume, Hands-free volume, Confirmation tone, Emergency tone

> Silent/Sleep mode

Visual notifications only (torch LED flashes, notifications on the external display), no ringtone, no vibration function

> Meeting/Theater mode

Visual notifications (torch LED flashes, notifications on the external display), device vibrates, no ringtone

> Maximum/Bus mode

Key tones, SMS tone and vibration function activated, ringtone volume is set on maximum

7.2 Voicemail number

Enter the number for your voicemail.

You will find this number in the documents supplied by your network provider. Press and hold the 1 to listen to your voicemail.

7.3 Security settings

- PIN: PIN request on/off, change PIN
- Phone code: on/off, change (factory preset code: 1234)

7.4 Master reset

You can restore all the factory settings on your phone (factory preset code: 1234).

8. EMPORIA EMERGENCY CALL FUNCTION

If you use the battery cover with the integrated emergency button, you can enable the phone's emergency call function. Read the instructions carefully and set the emergency call function according to your needs.

You can save up to five emergency numbers (family members, friends and official institutions).

- In an emergency, press and hold the emergency button on the back of the phone. (This works even when the phone is closed.)
- The five preset numbers will be dialled automatically in the order you have saved them in.
 If it is not possible to get through to anyone on the first number, the second number will automatically be dialled.
 If it is not possible to get through to anyone on the second number, the third number will automatically be dialled, and so on. (The phone will go through a list of five numbers a maximum of three times.)
- At the same time as each emergency call, a text message (SMS) will be sent to the contact, saying: "You are about to receive an emergency call. Press 3x0 within 1 min, otherwise call will be dropped automatically."
- The contact must press the 0 key three times within 60 seconds, or the call will be disconnected (to prevent your emergency call going through to a contact's mailbox).

- From the moment you make an emergency call, your emporia phone will automatically answer any incoming calls for one hour. To disable this function, press and hold the button for approx. three seconds or turn your device off completely using the button and then turn it on again.
- To cancel the emergency call, press and hold
- During the emergency call, a warning tone will sound continuously, to alert anyone nearby and the person being called
- If you do not have any emergency numbers saved, have no credit on your prepaid phone card or are connected to a foreign network without permission (e.g. roaming is not activated), 112 will be dialled when you press the emergency button.
- If you want to add the number of an official institution such as the police or fire brigade as an emergency number, you must check that this is okay with the respective institution beforehand. We do not assume liability for any costs incurred through you calling such an institution by mistake.

> Adding/editing emergency numbers

- ⇒ Select an entry (e.g. **EmNo. 1)** by pressing \(\bigcap \)

> Activating the emergency button

> Pre alarm

The pre alarm is a warning tone that sounds for ten seconds and alerts anyone nearby to the emergency call.

After this, the emergency call sequence starts.
